

Texas A&M senior punter Cody Scates was released from the Brazos County jail Tuesday at 11:43 a.m. on a \$4,000 bond after being charged with malicious mischief, a Class B misdemeanor. Scates was arrested by College

Station police and was transferred to Brazos County jail, where he stayed for about 10 minutes.

The maximum sentence for conviction on a Class B misdemeanor is a \$2,000 fine and 180 days in jail.

Details of the incident were not available Wednesday night from the College Station Police Department.

#### Men's basketball loses to Kansas State 70-61

After holding a lead as high as six with 11 minutes to play, the Aggie men's basketball team fell to unranked Kansas Sate 70-61 last night in Manhattan, Kan.
