

Toccara Williams had a careerhigh nine steals as part of the Aggies' 22 steals that night and will be playing her first game as Big 12 all-time steals leader, a title she earned last Saturday after gaining her 419th steal during the game versus University of Oklahoma.

For the past two games, the Aggies have instituted a press defense, but it is still unclear if the Aggies will continue it during the game tonight.

The Aggies will be led by Williams along with sophomore forward Tamea Scales, who gained a starting spot on the squad after her performance versus Texas in December. Freshman guard Tiffany Jackson and senior forward Stacy Stephens will lead Texas.

"(Stephens) doesn't take any crap," Blair said. "The nine-player rotation (Texas) has is just tremendous. They just don't miss a beat."

Despite not starting, Jackson was the high scorer for Texas last time the two teams played with 15 points. She has since become a starter.

A&M head coach Gary Blair said he looks forward to the opportunity to play such highly ranked teams.

"This is why I am here (at A&M)," Blair said. "I want to play teams in the top 25."


Blair said Texas has a good chance at staying No. 1 and winning the National Championship.

elbow, it's really tough."

The difference between the two teams is simple: Nebraska wasn't expected to win this season while the Aggies were poised for a breakout year with Big 12 Freshman of the Year Antoine Wright returning for his sophomore campaign.

Wright has been a disappointnt thus far after being billed as a potential NBA lottery pick by NBADraft.net, averaging just 13.7 points and 4.3 rebounds per game after averaging 14.5 points and 6.6 rebounds during the 2002-03 campaign.

With the departure of guard Bernard King after last season, Watkins said Wright has become the target of opposing

"He's just really got that sophomore-itis I guess," Watkins said. "After coming in after that freshman year where he didn't have that Bulls' Eye on his back, he's got it now. We surely thought he'd be doing a little more than what he's been doing offensively and defensively this season."

With the mounting losses, it's easy to see the frustration on the faces of Aggie players as they walk off the court. The Cornhuskers on the other hand have been uplifted by their double-digit win over Missouri.

"The coaching staff has kept this team together," said Nebraska senior guard Nate Johnson: "Anything can happen, the season is not over, anything can happen in the next seven, eight games. We have to have confidence in ourselves and be humble."

If the Aggies want to regain the confidence they had and gain the sense of confidence that Nebraska has gained, then a win over the resurgent Cornhuskers is a must.

Without a win Wednesday, the Aggies could never circle another win this season.

"There is still some good basketball to be played with this team," Watkins said. "I know it's there, but saying it is one thing doing is another.'

Rain postpones Aggie women's softball game

Texas A&M recruit arrested after alleged robbery

Texas A&M football recruit Quentin Gardner was arrested in Tyler Saturday for allegedly robbing two women outside a department store, according to the Dallas Morning News.

He was charged with robbery, a second-degree felony, attempted theft from a person, a Class A misdemeanor and evading arrest, a Class B misdemeanor, according to the article.

Gardner is a senior at Robert E. Lee High School in Tyler. He signed a letter of intent to play football for Texas A&M last Wednesday.

Gardner was a defensive back for Lee and was

expected to remain at that position for A&M. Knight's former house to be sold on Internet

BLOOMINGTON, Ind. (AP) — A 4,660-square-foot home that once belonged to former Indiana men's basketball coach Bob Knight has been put up for auction on the Internet. The home, spread across nearly five acres of

secluded land in Bloomington,

features five walk-in closets, a 546-square-foot study, skylights and a nearly 300 square-foot master bathroom equipped with a "jetted tub" and steam room for two.

A posting on the Internet auction site eBay seeks \$397,500 for the home, or more than three times the median value of a home in Bloomington.

Knight, 63, who now coaches at Texas Tech, sold the house to Bloomington resident Scott E. Swaffar in March for \$375,000, according to Monroe County property records.

The house, which was built in 1982 and is assessed at \$275,000, has four bedrooms and four bathrooms.

The Jan. 23 posting on eBay makes no secret of the home's famous previous owner: "Rare opportunity to live in the house 'The General' lived in for his last 16 years while he was the basketball coach of Indiana University.

Knight was fired from Indiana in September 2000 for what then-school president Myles Brand called his "pattern of unacceptable behavior." Knight had led the Hoosiers to three national championships and 11 Big Ten titles.

Nolan Ryan may work for Houston Astros

HOUSTON (AP) -Now that he's cut ties with the Texas Rangers Hall of Fame pitcher Nolan Ryan is free to start working again with the Houston Astros.

The possible move makes sense. Ryan already owns the Round Rock Express, which is the Astros' Double-A team and is expected to become a Triple-A team in 2005. He also is co-owner of a Corpus Christi minor league team, which will become the Astros' Double-A team in 2005.

Astros general manager Gerry Hunsicker said Tuesday that Ryan and Astros owner Drayton McLane Jr. have had several conversations about a possible position with the organization.

Ryan has said that he would be able to walk across the parking lot to the Round Rock stadium and be involved. He said it was natural that if he develops a relationship with another club that it would be Houston.

Ryan ended his formal relationship with the Rangers on Monday by deciding not to sign a new personal services contract.

Ryan pitched for the Astros from 1980-88.

He was 324-292 with 5,714 strikeouts and a 3.19 ERA in 27 major league seasons with the New York Mets, California, Houston and Texas. The Angels, Astros and Rangers have all retired his jersey.

He spent the final five seasons of his career (1989-93) with the Rangers, throwing the last two of his seven no-hitters and recording his 5,000th career strikeout during that span.

Rice, University of Houston accused of holding parties with strippers for recruits

HOUSTON (AP) — Students from Houston's two Division I-A schools hired topless dancers for parties possibly involving football recruits without the knowledge of the institutions, the head of the company that supplied the strippers said Tuesday.

The purpose of the parties wasn't completely clear, said Steve Lower, president and chief executive officer of Denver-based Hardbodies Entertainment Inc., which has branches in

Houston and Las Vegas. Lower said Tuesday that student-athletes were involved, but later characterized them only as students.

According to NCAA rules on entertaining recruits, a school "may not arrange or permit excessive entertainment," though it doesn't specifically mention what students may or may not do on their own.

The NCAA didn't return a call seeking further clarification.
