A&M picked up momentum last weekend with some impressive performances. Senior Melissa Gulli broke the school record for the 5,000-meter run in 16.03 and qualified for the NCAA championships in the process. Also, freshman Monique Lee broke the school record for the 200 meters as she finished third in the race with a time of 24.18.

On the men's side, Nelson expects the Aggies to compete for the championship. Yet, he said he knows it will be tough battling the best in Nebraska's home facility, the Devaney Complex. "Unfortunately, we don't have an indoor facil-

ity, so this will be a challenge for us," Nelson said. "We're looking forward to it, though."
