Sophomore first baseman Lindsay Park crushed a three-run home run in the second inning of Saturday's contest with the Sun Devils to give A&M a 3-0 lead, but ASU would rally back to score five unanswered runs in the fifth to claim the victory.

A&M opens Big 12 play at 2 p.m. on March 27th when they host No. 7 Oklahoma at the Aggie Softball Field.

Astros take Dodgers 10-7

VERO BEACH, Fla. (AP) -Hideo Nomo said he isn't worried that his poor preseason will carry over to the regular season.

Nomo's Grapefruit League ERA soared to 9.17 Sunday after giving up seven runs in five innings as the Los Angeles Dodgers lost 10-7 to the Houston Astros at Holman Stadium.

Nomo, 35, has given up 18 earned runs, 28 hits, 17 extra-base hits and six homers in 17 2/3 innings this spring. Opponents are batting .384 against him.

Nomo went 16-13 with a 3.09 ERA last year.

NORMAN, Okla. (AP) -Michael Hollimon hit a RBIsingle in the top of the ninth and J. Brent Cox had strikeouts on the inning's final two outs, leading Texas to a 5-4 win over Oklahoma on

Texas (26-3, 2-1 Big 12) has won 15 of its last 16 games, with the only loss coming against the Sooners (12-9, 1-2) on Saturday.

The Longhorns scored three runs in the fifth inning, getting RBI singles from Carson Kainer, Drew Stubbs and Hunter Harris. That spurt gave Texas a 3-2 lead.

Texas and Oklahoma each scored a run in the eighth inning, then Hollimon drove in Kainer to put the Longhorns up 5-3 in the ninth

Oklahoma's Ryan Rohlinger had a RBI single to pull the Sooners within 5-4, but Cox threw two strikeouts to earn

his third save of the season. Justin Simmons (5-1) gave up two runs on five hits in the win. The loser was Mark Roberts (4-2).
