ent areas of health education said Kristin Feuerbach, a community health major. "The field is changing so much at the time. Learning more really helps me to focus on really making a difference."

Clark said 43 million people in the United States are insured. The growing population and average age is getting older. Difficulties arise in encouraging high quality lifestyles and increased lifespan.

The nation is also experiencing dramatic increases in obesity, which is causing major disparities in the health status of different sub-groups. It is important that the public health educators develop leadership qualities to confront these daunting challenges, Clark said.

"An important piece of advice I give to you students is to have courage," Clark said. "It takes a great deal of courage to take certain people that have extreme views on things. Become an advocate for policy change. Learn to enjoy challenges. The profession needs leaders."

She said several cities already established this system with success.

"Other cities have the over the phone service where people can use their credit card but there is a surcharge involved with that. With our service there is no surcharge," Pharris said.

Pharris said the Bryant street payment will not be offered to juveniles or offenses involving alcohol or tobacco.

Sgt. Benton Kilgore said the traffic division of the Bryan Police Department is looking to expand by approximately 10 officers, and the amount of citations will increase when more officers are working traffic.

In 2003, the city of Bryan issued 16,147 citations and brought in \$2,016,442. The municipal court operates on a budget of approximately \$1.2 million per fiscal year, Pharris said.

Julie Kuder, College Station court administrator, expects College Station to follow suit.

"We expect our Web site to be able to take ticket payments three to six months," Kuder said.

year after year on behalf of the students," Josefy said.

Bernice Alford, MSC main desk employee and guest room clerk, said student identification cards get sent to the Pavilion, driver licenses get sent to the Department of Public Safety and credit cards are destroyed if all are unclaimed.

Tisius said that if student IDs are in a wallet, the main desk will attempt to contact a student through Neo e-mail.

Alford said that, after about a month, many buildings and departments will send their lost and found items to the MSC main desk.

Buildings such as Blocker, the Student Computing Center, Wehner and Sterling C. Evans Library are other places that

have separate lost and founds, which send items to the MSC main desk, Tisius said.

"We tell people to look first where they lost (their belongings) before they come to us," Tisius said. "If their stuff isn't here then we tell them to check back in a couple of days."

Tisius said Transit Services drops lost items off daily to the MSC main desk, while lost items from the Rec Center take about a month to arrive.

Sophomore international studies major Robby Cale said the auction is an unusual event.

"I'm sure I'm not the only one who hasn't heard of (the MSC lost and found)," Cale said. "I'd hate to be someone who recognized something at the auction and didn't have the money to buy it back."
