# Forest Service's use of photo to support logging criticize

RENO, Nev. — The Forest Service has been accused of misrepresenting forest conditions by using misleading photographs in a brochure that urges more logging to prevent wildfires in the Sierra Nevada.

The pamphlet, created by a public relations firm, explains that fire risks have risen as the Sierra's forests have grown more dense the past century. Six small black-and-white photos spanning 80 years appear beside descriptions of how the "forests of the past" had fewer trees and less underbrush, making them less susceptible to fire.

The 1909 photo shows an open, park-like forest with large trees spaced widely apart. More trees and underbrush appear in each successive picture — 1948, 1958, 1968, 1979 — and finally a photograph thick with trees in 1989.

"Today's forests, dense with green, may seem beautiful, but in fact are deadly," the pamphlet reads. "Our old-growth forests are choking with brush, tinderdry debris and dead trees which make the risk of catastrophic fire high.'

However, the 1909 photo does not depict natural conditions - it was taken just after the forest had been logged.

And the pictured forest is nowhere near the Sierra Nevada. It's in Montana.

"I was looking at the picture and I thought it looked awful familiar," said Chad Hanson, director of the John Muir Project in Cedar Ridge, Calif. "I started

looking around and sure enough, industry has used it before in Montana. It's from the Bitterroot Valley.

Then Hanson used a magnifying glass make another discovery.

"You can see huge slash piles and stumps in the background," he said. "They give impression

WASHINGTON (AP) - In an effort to shield themselves from potential lawsuits, American Airlines and one of its technology providers are pointing fingers at each other over who allowed some 1.2 million passenger records to be shared with four companies doing aviation security research for the government.

AMR Corp., the parent of American Airlines, dis-

closed late Friday that it authorized Mi Automation Inc., to share the passenger data with Transportation Security Administration in June 201

However, the Fort Worth, Texas-based airline said never gave Airline Automation the authority to st the data with the four research companies-Software Inc., Infoglide Software Corp., ko Technology Inc. and Lockheed Martin Corp.
