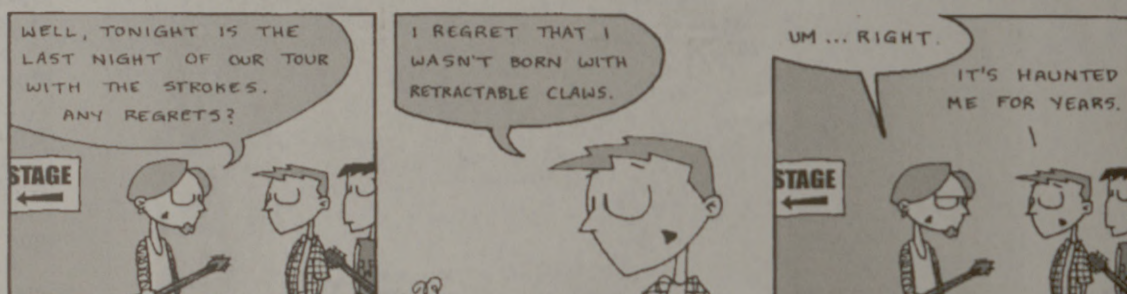

Israel identifies new Hamas leader

JERUSALEM (AP) — Mahmoud Zahar, a 30-year-old Egyptian-trained militant who's son was killed in an Israeli airstrike, was named Monday as the new Hamas leader in Gaza Strip. Israeli officials signaled he won't be targeted for death if the military halts suicide attacks.
 Hamas, however, refused to reveal the name of its new leader for fear he will be assassinated like his two predecessors. Late Monday, Palestinians were killed in an incident near the refugee camp in central Gaza. Palestinian security officials said there was an explosion followed by machine gun

Gromatzky said. "You can't keep parking on the surface."

To unify the campus, planners want to extend the "spine" of the campus, which begins at the intersection of Texas Avenue and New Main Drive, and continues with a series of quadrangles and roads, past the Kleberg Building and the Heep Complex on West Campus, Dennis said.

To achieve this goal, the plan includes renovation of the open space between the Langford Architecture Center and the O&M Building and additions to the History Building. Also, Jones and W. Lamar streets will be extended to Wellborn Road, and pedestrian and vehicle underpasses will connect them

with Olsen Boulevard on the other side of Wellborn and the railroad, Gromatzky said.

Miller said the University will work around the railroad rather than move it because the University and community members could not agree upon a new location for it.

The plan includes significant changes to Wellborn Road as well. "The distance between east and West Campus is real as well as perceived," Dennis said. "The area must be developed to make people feel that it's not so far."

Wellborn will be turned from a state highway into a boulevard with an island and lined with trees, Gromatzky said.

"You see Wellborn as a problem now, but it can become just another street on campus," Gromatzky said.

After the changes, motorists

will probably choose to take F.M. 2818 to get across campus rather than Wellborn, said Tom Woodfin, associate vice president for administration.

Future construction includes a proposed group of residence halls on West Campus near the intersection of Wellborn and University Drive as well as developing West Creek Greenway, a natural landscape, behind the Kleberg Building and Heep Building.

Landscape guidelines and goals include extending the grid of urban, tree-lined streets and creating harmony between the campus and the surrounding community.

Architectural guidelines include easily accessible entrances, masonry construction with like colors and buildings compatible with the height of

the historic core of the campus.

"You can achieve the things you want without building buildings," Gromatzky said. Miller said other University departments, including the Department of Residence and Transportation Services, currently or are about to be similar studies.

The results of these studies will be executed within the framework of this master plan. Changes will be allowed after approval from an all-campus committee on new construction and landscape changes.

Charles Sippal, vice president of administration, said he is supportive of the plan, and are currently working on a minutes order from the Texas System Board of Regents to institutionalize it, Miller said.
