# New regents chair aims to heal a divided Baylor

WACO (AP) — The new chairman of Baylor University's board of regents said he will aim to heal the divide that has formed between those who support the university's president and others who believe he should be replaced.

Will Davis, an Austin attorney who will take charge of the board on Tuesday, said he supports university President Robert B. Sloan Jr.

However, Davis said he would like Sloan to restore the trust and collegiality between the administration and faculty.

“Both sides have pretty well personalized it, and I can't tell you why,” he said in Monday's editions of the Austin American-Statesman. “Baylor is going in different directions, dealing with some residual heartbreak. Reconciliation is going to be difficult, and it's going to take time.”

The regents voted 18-17 in a May executive session to keep Sloan, whose ambitious Vision 2012 strategic plan for the university has divided the campus for years.

Last year's slaying of basketball player Patrick Denney, firing of basketball coach Dave Bliss and resignation of Athletic Director Tom Stanton have added to the anguish at the world's largest Baptist university.

A special regent review committee headed by Davis asked Sloan in February to revise several policies related to Vision 2012, which calls for the restoration of the school's Christian image and an increased drive for academic excellence.

The president has since abandoned a controversial two-tier faculty salary system and dis-

mantled a school alumni program he created that competed with the Baylor Alumni Association.

Sloan said he thinks Vision 2012 enjoys the “overwhelming support” of regents and faculty.

“Ultimately what is at stake is the future of Baylor University,” Sloan said. “I am very determined to press on with Baylor's calling as an institution of Christian learning.”

But the president has received two no-confidence votes from the faculty senate, which was outraged by the \$25 million in debt Baylor incurred to pay for a major building program and the creation of the two-tier salary system.

Charles Weaver, a faculty senate leader, said the changes Sloan has made aren't enough to repair the damage he has caused.

“If you are saying they should be commended for getting rid of the salary system, say you can't start a fire, put out the fire, and call yourself a hero in putting out the fire,” Weaver said. “One of the most fragile things in the world is trust, and when it's broken it is one of the hardest things to get back.”

Davis said he would like to give Sloan time to build on the changes he made as a result of the committee's review before the regents take another vote on his future.

Outgoing board chairman Drayton McLane Jr. said Sloan is one of the most capable people he's ever been around.

“He has a good heart,” McLane said. “He is a visionary person with a leadership style that is pretty aggressive. We need to get him to moderate that a little bit. It all comes from leadership.”

# Texas Roadhouse chain suing Texas bar for trademark infringement

AUSTIN (AP) — Regulars at the True Blue Texas Roadhouse say they're outraged that a Kentucky-based bar and restaurant chain is suing their bar for using “Texas” and “Roadhouse” in its name.

The Texas Roadhouse restaurant chain sued the La Vernia bar and owner Douglas Bode last month in U.S. District Court in Austin.

The Louisville, Ky.-based chain, which has 165 restaurants in 30 states, contends the bar committed trademark infringement.

Bode said he came up with the name on a late-night drive with friends. He researched the name with a clerk in Wilson County and determined the name was available. The bar opened two years ago.

“I am just trying to make a living. I don't want to offend anybody,” Bode, a 38-year-old former curtain company production manager, said in Sunday's editions of the Austin American-Statesman. “For God's sake, I'm a Texas bar. Why can't I use that name?”

The chain's attorney, Tom Walsh, wrote in the lawsuit that by using the terms in his bar's name, Bode “calculated to deceive the relevant consuming public into accepting and purchasing Bode's services in the mistaken belief that they are Texas Roadhouse's services.”

Walsh said the corporation tried to reach an out-of-court settlement with Bode.

“We attempted to negotiate in good faith for many months,” Walsh said. “We believe that my client has superior rights to the trademarks, and frankly, we believe we have a duty to protect our intellectual property.”

The corporation has 24 franchises in Texas, including bar-restaurants off major highways in Waco, San Antonio and Killeen. The first restaurant opened in 1993 in Indiana.

The nearest Texas Roadhouse restaurant to the La Vernia bar is about 20 miles away in Live Oak.

Austin lawyer Louis Pirkey, a past president of the American Intellectual Property Law Association, said a geographical name such as Texas would be protected by trademark law if it has “significant secondary meaning.”

Philadelphia Cream Cheese couldn't be changed to Bob's Philadelphia Cream Cheese, he said.

“The question is: Would consumers be likely to be confused between the two names?” Pirkey said in Sunday's online edition of the Austin American-Statesman. “Frequently a name can be embedded in another name and still cause likely confusion.”
