hit a two-run homer in the seventh to tie the game.

In the earlier matchup, Rice's Jeff Niemann (6-3) pitched a four-hit complete game as Rice defeated Texas

A&M 3-1 to force the championship game rematch.

Rice took a 2-0 lead after Erik Schindewolf scored in the first inning on Janish's sacrifice fly and Adam Morris scored on a single by Cavanaugh in the second.

Pennington, the hottest hitter in the tournament, went 2-for-3 and knocking

in the Aggies' only run with a single in the third.

Austin Davis' leaping grab in the seventh inning robbed Infante of a solo home run that would have pulled Texas A&M within one run.

After a controversial balk in the fourth inning, Niemann did not give up a hit and he retired 17 of the next 19 batters that he

faced. He struck out nine.

Zach Jackson (10-6) took the loss, giving up 12 hits, three earned runs and striking out nine in the game.

The Aggies will have a week before facing off against Louisiana State University on June 11. Regional host sites for the tournaments will be announced at a later date.

### SPORTS IN BRIEF Men's Golf nails top-20 finish at NCAA Tournament

The Aggies earned a 14th place finish Friday at the 107th NCAA Men's Golf Championships at The Homestead's Cascades Golf Course in Hot Springs, Va. The Aggies shot 300 on the last day, making it the ninth-highest finish in school history.

Coming off a disappointing 10th place finish at the Big 12 Championships, the Aggies earned the berth to Nationals with a fourth place finish at the NCAA Central Regional two weeks ago.

The University of California closed play with a one-under-par 279 in the final round to capture the national championship with a 1,134 total. UCLA was six shots behind, followed by University of Arizona and the University of Texas.

A&M seniors Stephen Reed and David Tasker closed their college careers with a 72 and a 73, while junior David Schultz contributed a 76 and sophomores Andrew Parr and Rand Arbuckle each had a 79. Reed tied for 36th overall with a 291 total, while Tasker tied for 40th (292), Schultz tied for 44th (294), Parr tied for 60th (298) and Arbuckle placed 75th (305).

### Women golfers set school records

The Texas A&M women's golf team finished 23rd with a score of 301 on Friday, May 21 at the NCAA Women's Golf Championships at the Grand National Lake Course in Opelika, Ala.

The Aggies earned a school record for a 72-hole tournament with a total score of 1211 after shooting a 304 (292), Schultz tied for 44th (294), Parr tied for 60th (298) and Arbuckle placed 75th (305).

Junior Kyla Neal and freshman Christa Spedding posted final round two-over-par 74s. Spedding also set an individual school record for 72 holes with a score of 297. Spedding tied for 45th and Neal tied for 99th with a 309 total.

UCLA claimed the national title with a three-stroke victory over Oklahoma State. Nationally top-ranked Duke University followed, just ahead of University of California.

All five starters for the Aggies will be returning next year, boosting A&M's chances of achieving a top-10 finish in the championships.

### Big 12 Baseball Regional Wrapup

After three days and 21 baseball games this weekend, the field of six Big 12 teams in regional play hoping to advance to the College World Series was reduced to two.

Texas A&M and top ranked University of Texas were the only two Big 12 teams to advance to next round of regional play, only one round from the world series.

Texas, heavily favored by many to win the championship this year, wasted no time in winning its regional tournament, winning in the minimum of three games. The Longhorns scored at least seven runs and held its opponents to four runs or less in each game.

Big 12 champion Oklahoma State surprisingly lost in three games, while underdog Texas Tech University surprised many critics, advancing to the regional final game where the Raiders lost to Georgia Tech, 5-3.

University of Missouri and the University of Oklahoma were eliminated in three games in similar fashion, losing to their first round opponent by a big deficit, winning the second with late inning runs and blown out in the third game.

Super regional tournament play begins June 11 in select cities, and teams that advance from those games will play in the College World Series beginning June 18 in Omaha, Neb.
