



In a ruling last year, the 9th U.S. Circuit Cor Progra of Appeals in San Francisco said the language the First Amendment and the Supreme Court precedents make clear that tax-supported school cannot lend their imprimatur to a declaration fealty to "one nation under God."

That decision set off a national uproar a would have stripped the reference to God fromth version of the pledge said by about 9.6 million schoolchildren in California and other Wester states covered by the appeals court.
