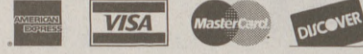

Lance Armstrong disputes claims of drug use

SILVER SPRING, Md. (AP) — Lance Armstrong juggled controversy and ceremony Tuesday, promising to take action against "absolute untrue" doping accusations announcing a new sponsor.

Armstrong strongly denied claims by a former assistant, a new book in which the assistant says Armstrong once asked her to dispose of used syringes and to give him makeup to conceal needle marks on his arms.

The allegations took some of the shine away from the announcement of a three-year, multimillion-dollar deal with Discovery, which will replace the U.S. Postal Service as the sponsor of Armstrong's team.

"This is not the first time I've lived through this. I heard it in 1999. I heard it in 2002, again in 2003. It happens all the time," said Armstrong. "We're sick and tired of these accusations and we're going to do everything we can to fight them."

Agassi pulls out of Wimbledon

(AP) — Whether it's his ailing hip or his ailing game, Andre Agassi decided he wasn't ready for Wimbledon.

Agassi pulled out of the year's third Grand Slam tournament Tuesday, joining the two top-ranked women on the sidelines.

Agassi, whose eight Grand Slam titles include Wimbledon in 1992, dropped his last four matches — his longest losing streak in seven years. Agassi also lost to a qualifier ranked 339th, a qualifier ranked 27th playing his first four-level match, and a player ranked 60th. All but one of the four ended in straight sets.

Agassi is one of the most popular and successful tennis players in history. He's one of five men with a career Grand Slam and was ranked No. 1 recently as last season, the oldest man to hold the top spot. He's also the last player to win consecutive Slams, at the 1999 U.S. Open and 2000 Australian Open.

Reds nip Rangers in 11 innings

CINCINNATI (AP) — The Texas Rangers kept Ken Griffey Jr. stuck at 499 homers, but the Cincinnati Reds ended their seven-game losing streak Tuesday when Barry Larkin singled in the 11th for a 5-4 victory.

The Reds rebounded from a disastrous 0-7 trip by rallying to tie it in the ninth off closer Francisco Cordero, who has been perfect in 19 save opportunities. Jason LaRue's run-scoring single tied it at 4.

Flashbulbs popped every time Griffey came to the plate, hoping to make a little bit of hometown history. He had an RBI double in the first inning off Kenny Rogers, then struck out and grounded out against the left-hander.

The crowd tossed plastic beer bottles onto the field in the eighth after the Rangers intentionally walked Griffey with runner on third.

Astros lose again

HOUSTON (AP) — Ramon Martinez's two-run double capped a three-run ninth inning, lifting the Chicago Cubs past the Houston Astros 4-2 on Tuesday night.

Aramis Ramirez hit a tying RBI single in the ninth off closer Octavio Dotel, who blew his third save in 15 chances. The Astros looked headed for their second shutout loss in the sixth.

The Astros, forced to juggle recent injuries to Jeff Bagwell, Adam Everett and Rich Hidalgo, finished with nine but left 12 men on base.
