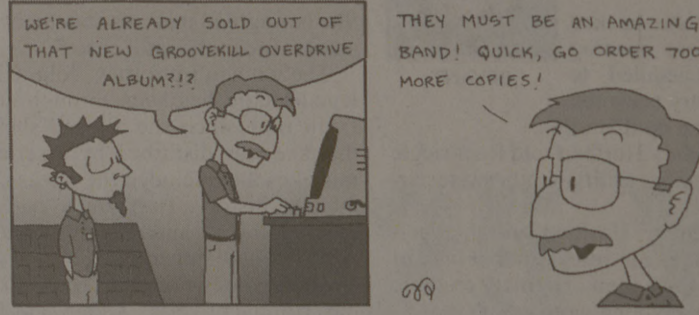
online instead of those made available to him.

Office of University Relations said no lawsuit has been filed against the University or any of its employees in regards to the incident.

Lawson declined to comment on accounts from residents of the University Apartments that several apartments reported gas odor prior to the explosion.

"What I can tell you is that University maintenance workers have been out to the apartments and are in the middle of replacing all gas lines," Lawson said. "There are a lot of people working some very long hours to ensure that those lines are safe."

Many University Apartments residents are pleased to see the DA open an investigation into the incident.

"I think that it is very good that Mr. Turner has decided to open an investigation. I also think that Dr. Gates has done the right thing by waiting on the task force," said Rahul Ribiero, president of the University Apartments Community Council. "If this investigation (by the District Attorney) sheds more light on what was responsible, I don't think residents will mind waiting a few more weeks."

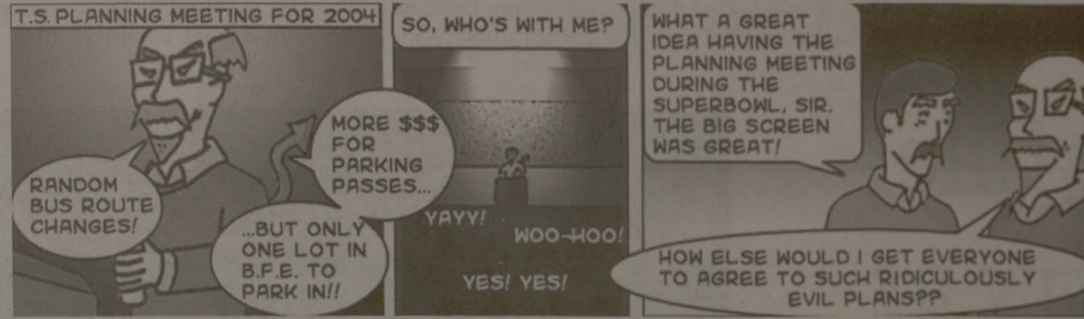

convention city, collecting the endorsement of the union representing New York's 8,600 firefighters, some of whom risked their lives on Sept. 11, 2001. His eyes misted as he stood among them and held a black fire helmet labeled "Commander in Chief."

"Four more years," they shouted — echoing the chants that floated up from the convention floor several miles away as delegates acclaimed the

Bush-Cheney ticket for another term.

The speeches by Cheney and Miller were the main events of the evening, but the convention seemed to move 20 years back in time at one point as delegates took in a tribute to the late Ronald Reagan. They cheered at video clips of the late president at his most forceful, then again when they saw former President George H.W. Bush eulogizing him in June. Madison Square Garden bloomed with thousands of blue placards that read "Win One for The Gipper."
