Dugat said a revitalization of the SGA constitution was a major priority, but that he wanted to see the senate live up to its potential.

"The first thing out of Rules and Regs will be a revitalization of the constitution, so that we can fulfill our primary purpose and the reason we exist, which is to be the voice of student at Texas A&M," Dugat said.

Foley echoed his colleagues, saying the revamping of the constitution was a major priority. Foley also spoke about the issue of reapportionment.

"Many senators have talked about adding constituencies for athletics and Greek organizations," Foley said. "It seems like a great idea, but I'm just concerned about triple and quadruple representation.
