A&M sells used items on eBay

Sept. 6, 2004 — It seems garage sales have gone high tech - even in Aggieland.

Texas A&M will put up various items for sale — including 20 buses used by its transportation services department to move students around campus — on eBay starting today, hoping to take advantage of the international power and attention of the internet, says Rex Janne, director of purchasing services.

Janne is hoping that by placing items on eBay, the interest will grow by the thousands or even more.

"The Internet is a good tool to use for selling items no longer needed by the university or a school district, and we want to explore it more," Janne said.

"We've had some success in recent months with some specialty items, but we want to see what the interest level is for larger ticket

items, such as the shuttle bus and other vehicles and equipment.

Janne said the Texas A&M athletic department contacted the office last spring to see if it could sell some sports jerseys and used by the women's softball and soccer teams.

The items were placed on eBay and quickly sold out, he said.

"The response we got was excellent," he said.

"We thought there would be a good response for sports memorabilia items, but now we want to see if we can get the same response for other items, such as lab equipment, furniture and vehicles."

While most items are not found in typical office and building supply stores, some are not.

"We sold a stuffed 2-headed pig that someone had mounted in 1940s and was the property of the College of Veterinary Medicine," Janne recalls. "That has to be the strangest item I can recall."

Aggie fans asked to recycle

Sept. 6, 2004 — This Saturday, (Sept. 11) marks the first home football game at Texas A&M University as well as the first weekend recycling bins will be available at Kyle Field, giving fans an opportunity to help the environment through an innovative process.

"Fans attending the football game will be asked to place their plastic bottles in the clearly marked recycle bins around the stadium, rather than dropping them in the stands," said Laura McMullen, Texas

as Environmental Action Coalition (TEAC) president.

Only the plastic bottles should be deposited in the bins because other materials such as glass and trash will ruin the recycling process, said McMullen.

TEAC and the Environmental Issues Committee, with the cooperation of the Student Government Association and the Texas A&M Athletic Department, are collecting the bottles for Earthpak, an environmentally friendly Texas-based backpack maker.

The bottles will be ground into plastic pellets to make backpacks for the company.

Texas Aggie Band Show begins new season Sept. 16

The "Texas Aggie Band Show" will begin its 10th season on its flagship stations, KAMU-TV and KAMU-Xtra, on Thursday, Sept. 16.

The 12-week, 30-minute program provides viewers with an inside look at life in Texas A&M's Fightin' Texas Aggie Band and includes each week's Aggie Band halftime drill at the Texas A&M football game.

The show is underwritten by The Association of Former Students, produced by Barker Productions and made available to PBS audiences throughout Texas by KAMU-TV.

The upcoming season brings two major changes to the program.

First, Don Powell, '56 a former band member who has hosted the show since its premier in 1995, has retired. Bruce Bockhorn, '74, a former drum major, will succeed him. Bockhorn has served as the campus correspondent for the show during the past

two years.

Second, the show will now include a special feature each week titled, "RECALL!" This segment will highlight a former member of the Aggie Band who has gone on to a successful business, professional or military career.

The show will air at 10:30 p.m. Thursdays and 5:30 p.m. Saturdays on KAMU-TV (Channel 4) and at 8 p.m. Mondays on KAMU-Xtra (Cox Channel 3) starting Sept. 16.
