addition, these radars are extremely sensitive electronics necessary for minimizing noise. Guynes said.

The main radar system of the National Hurricane Center, repaired in time to monitor the landfall of Frances. The SMART radar systems were deployed to two small airports at Cape Canaveral, Fla., to monitor the north quadrant of the storm at landfall.

"It was a tremendous honor for the SMART radar system to be called on to support the Center," Guynes said.

Zachary Glenn, senior meteorology major and president of the SCAMS, a social organization for undergraduate and graduate students in meteorology at A&M, said he is proud that A&M is involved with the SMART system.

"The calling on the SMART radars is a great show of our meteorology community that we are ready to help in time of need," Glenn said.
