Tuesday released more than two dozen pages of records about Bush and his former Texas unit. They showed Bush flew for 336 hours in military jets after his flight training and ranked in the middle of his class.

The latest records do not shed any light on key questions about Bush's service: whether or where he trained

The ship "Overseas Marilyn," hich left Africa on Aug. 13, was untary quarantined in the Gulf Mexico while the Centers for sease Control and Prevention Atlanta awaited blood and tissamples for testing. The man ed Aug. 31 and his body was moved from the ship Sunday. Lassa fever is spread by rodent oppings and urine or by conet with the bodily fluid of an fected individual. The virus can use hypertension, shock, fever d death in severe cases, CDC

rus, which has a six- to 21-day incubation period and symptoms include fever, muscle aches, sore throat, nausea and chest and abdominal pain. "About 80 percent of human infections are pretty mild and asymptomatic."

Crew members aboard the ship, which arrived at the entrance to the Houston Ship Channel on Sunday, have been visited by infectious disease specialists and will continue to be monitored, said Michael Hanson, a spokesman for New York-based OSG Shipping Management Inc., which operates the ship.
