

Senior quarterback Cumbie proved Saturday that it akes a special kind of talent to succeed in Leach's spread offense stem - the kind of talent that eparted signal-callers Kliff Kingsury and B.J. If you are a fan of the lopsided victory over the down-to-the-wire even match-up, tune in to ABC at 2:30 p.m. on Saturday to catch the No. 2 Oklahoma Sooners as they look to destroy The University of Oregon in Norman, Okla.

This time, the Ducks will fly into Memorial Stadium looking for an upset, but this one could get ugly. Oklahoma has put up 103 points of total offense in two contests, drubbing weaker opponents Bowling Green and Houston.

The Ducks' wings were clipped last weekend as they took one on the chin from Indiana University at home, losing 30-24, in a loss that cost them their No. 25 national ranking.

Oklahoma head coach Bob Stoops will field a team that carries powerful offensive weapons in senior quarterback and 2003 Heisman Trophy winner Jason White, freshman running back Adrian Peterson and senior receiver Mark Clayton. Stoops isn't considering Saturday's match-up to be a walk in the park, by any means.
