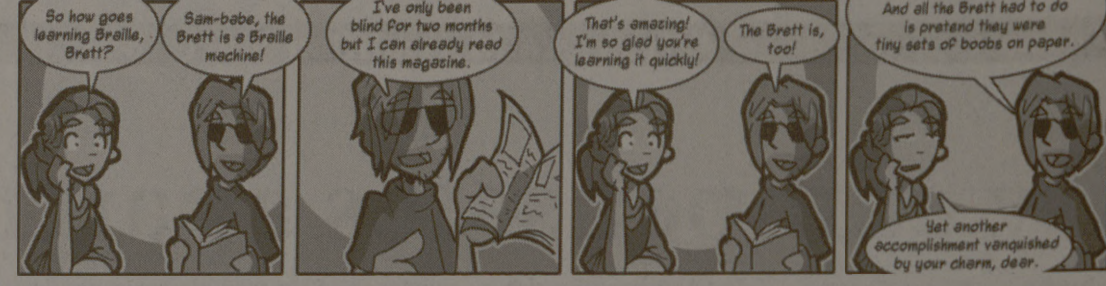

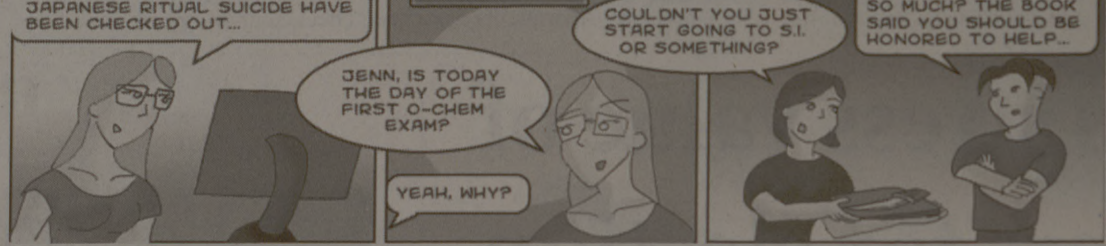

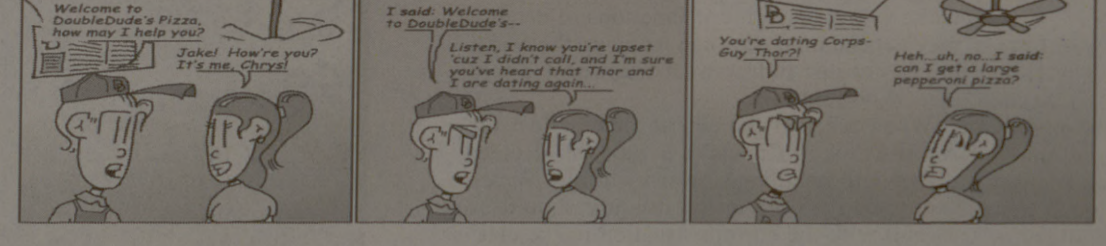

Act passed by Congress, Welch said that because of election, public education may become one of the issues getting attention from the administration and the public.

Hulse said education has typically been a big issue in election years, and that since both parties are betting that they will profit politically from the focus on Iraq, tuition increases in public universities probably would get more attention than before.

The audience questioned reporters about whether the media is biased and if the stories could be affected by advertisements.

Hulse said there are a lot of conservatives in the media and that doing a journalist's job sometimes is like doing business. Hulse ruled out the possibility that the Times cuts news stories that are not favoring advertisements.

When asked how he manages to get comprehensive but not too much information in covering the election, Welch said there is no neutral information.

"What I do is first to get information as much as possible from both parties, then go to the experts in institutes and universities like Dr. Wood to get opinions and analyses. They do research," Welch said.

Brian Foley, a senior political science major who was concerned about media bias, said he wished the panel discussion could be longer so he could ask more questions.

"The two individuals are not biased, though I think there are biased individuals and media. I feel appreciative to the Student Government Association for organizing the discussion," Foley said.
