"[Associate head coach Kelly Bond-White] did a great job of preparing our team for this game," Blair said. "This was her scout. She had it down pat. A lot of times it isn't the head coach; it's preparation by the assistant coaches. They get the work done, but sometime they're never given the credit they deserve."
Williams scored 23 points with five re-

bounds, while Walker added 13 points and

seven rebounds.

"I think it was a great way to get back on track after two losses," Williams said. "The last two games were not good because we didn't execute. This game, I think we really executed."

Jordan Jones had 10 assists in the game, which moved her into fifth on the all-time Aggie career assists list.

The Aggies dominated in the paint, outscoring the Tigers 40-18 inside and out-rebounded them 35-22.

The win moves the Aggies to 17-5 overall, 5-3 in SEC play. The Aggie women will travel to Columbia to take on Missouri Thursday.


It's not quite 2006-07 yet
